# Entry Requirements

- 18 years of age (required for placement)
- Valid Police Clearance
- Influenza and COVID-19 vaccinations or exemption
- Basic computer skills
- LLN skills at approximately AQF Level 3



## Work Placement

Work placement consists of 120 hours completed across two workplace blocks. SSI supports students in securing suitable placements in approved aged care settings.

## Assessments

Assessment includes written tasks, online quizzes, practical demonstrations, scenario responses and workplace evidence.



# Funding & Fees

This program is funded for eligible learners. Due to high demand and limited places, early enrolment is strongly recommended.

# Frequently Asked Questions

## **Do I need to arrange my own work placement?**

No. SSI assists with arranging all work placements.

## **What vaccinations do I need?**

You must have your annual influenza vaccination and COVID-19 vaccinations unless exempt.

## **Can I work while studying?**

Yes. The schedule supports part-time work. However, you need to tell us if you are working more than 20 hours per week. Talk to your trainer about this.

## **What support is available?**

LLN support, study support, career planning and trainer access.

## **Is AI allowed in assessments?**

AI may be used as a support tool, but final work must be your own. You should indicate if you have used AI in your assessments.



### **Do I need to attend all classes?**

The Government funding requires you to plan to attend all sessions. You must attend at least 80% of sessions.



### **Do I need good IT skills to participate in the course?**

You will use laptops to complete assessments and access to some resources on the Internet. Talk to us about our IT skills development course.
